
INTRODUCING YOUR NEXT NEWSLETTER EDITOR:

Lance started fly fishing with his father and brother Lincoln at age 7. In his teens, he began tying flies commercially for shops around Northern California. At 17, he went to work at Powell's Fly Shop in Chico, where he worked in the fly shop and built rods. He guided Powell's, conducted fly-tying and fly-fishing schools, and traveled.

In 1993, Lance and Kirsten started Saltwater Innovations, a company that manufactured and distributed products for saltwater fly fishing. Lance's Crystal Popper, Gray's Billfish Fly, the KO Charlie line, and the Raghead Crabs are all Saltwater Innovations products. Kirsten worked behind the scenes, handling the day-to-day operations and running the company's manufacturing floor.

In 2003, they launched Lance Gray & Company, a full-service outfitter offering <u>guided</u> <u>trips</u>, <u>fly-fishing tours</u>, <u>workshops</u>, and a travel agency. Lance conducts <u>presentations</u> at fly clubs and fly-fishing shows. While volunteering with veterans, Kirsten and Lance support local groups like Cub Scouts and 4H.

He's a signature tier for Aqua Flies, a pro staff member for Sage, RIO, Simms, Fishpond, and Umpqua Feather Merchants, and a featured writer, with articles published in Angling Trade Magazine, California Fly Fisher, Fly Fishermen, and <u>American Fly Fishing</u>.

Lance is a columnist. His column "The Foraging Angler" is published bi-monthly in the *California Fly Fisher Magazine*.

Kirsten is a fantastic photographer. Her images have been published in many fly-fishing/outdoor periodicals, such as Fly Fishermen and California Fly Fisher, and on websites throughout the fly-fishing industry.

February 1 & February 8

Our goal is to make you a more complete fly fisher. Casting is the most important part of fly fishing that we have to work on and can MAKE OR BREAK YOUR DAY. Your grade in succeeding in catching fish, and having an enjoyable, relaxing fishing experience depends for a substantial part on your ABILITY OR INABILITY to deliver a solid, well-presented cast, in a variety of different fishing situations.

Ask yourself a simple question: "Are you satisfied with your casting performance?"

We all know, most fly fishers want to improve their cast, and like to have some form of education to achieve their goal!

For more than 30 years, through our club casting clinics, we reached out to members of all casting levels. A lot of us answered the call and greatly benefited from our program. Don't miss this yearly opportunity, to improve and fine-tune your casting skills, and reach your goal, of becoming a better caster, and a more complete fly fisher. You'll be glad you did!

The casting clinics are conducted in a relaxing, noncompetitive environment, by our club FFI Certified Casting Instructors team. Sally Stoner, Debbie Cox, Todd Tose, Bob Hurd, Bernard Pieters. This session is a must and a major stepping stone for the next casting workout. It's clear and simple: if your casting mechanics are good, your casts are good!

FEBRUARY 8th Program

Casting Mechanics Part Two
Some presentation casts, and distance casting education.

Note: The program can be different depending on the group level you are in. The beginning casting level groups are focused on learning the fundamental casting mechanics that are needed to create a good cast. Some of the intermediate-level groups are expanding these mechanics a lot, combined with the other part of the program.

Due to high demand (and limited spots), YOU MUST SIGN UP SO EARLY AS POSSIBLE TO SECURE YOUR SPOT for 1 or 2 sessions.



This will be the 4th time for this catch-and-release event, open to fly and conventional gear, in the Owens Valley. Depending on the weather, you could be fishing from the Upper O all the way to Lone Pine! Same rules as before, so bring your friends, club members, and anyone else who likes a fun competition. As always, the special Beverage glasses go to the winning team members and individuals in both the fly and conventional classes.

When – February 08, 2025

Where – Saturday morning - (02/08/25) – We meet at Tri-County Fairgrounds and then you are off to your favorite places to fish. The tournament runs from 9 a.m. through 4 p.m. with dinner, raffles and awards at the Fairgrounds, starting at 6 p.m.

How – You will be using the iAngler app to score your catch so you MUST have a phone that can take photos and run the App. iAngler has been used successfully for each tournament and allows you to see how you and your team are doing compared to your competitors! All fish MUST be released unharmed.

Cost – 30.00 per individual and 25.00 per team, regardless of team size.

Scoring – The largest, smallest, and total fish are scored by the inch, measured to the nearest ½". There is a bonus for any fish over 14". Teams are scored by their total inches divided by the number of team players.


An individual regular membership is \$45.00 per year for 12 months (January through December).


















